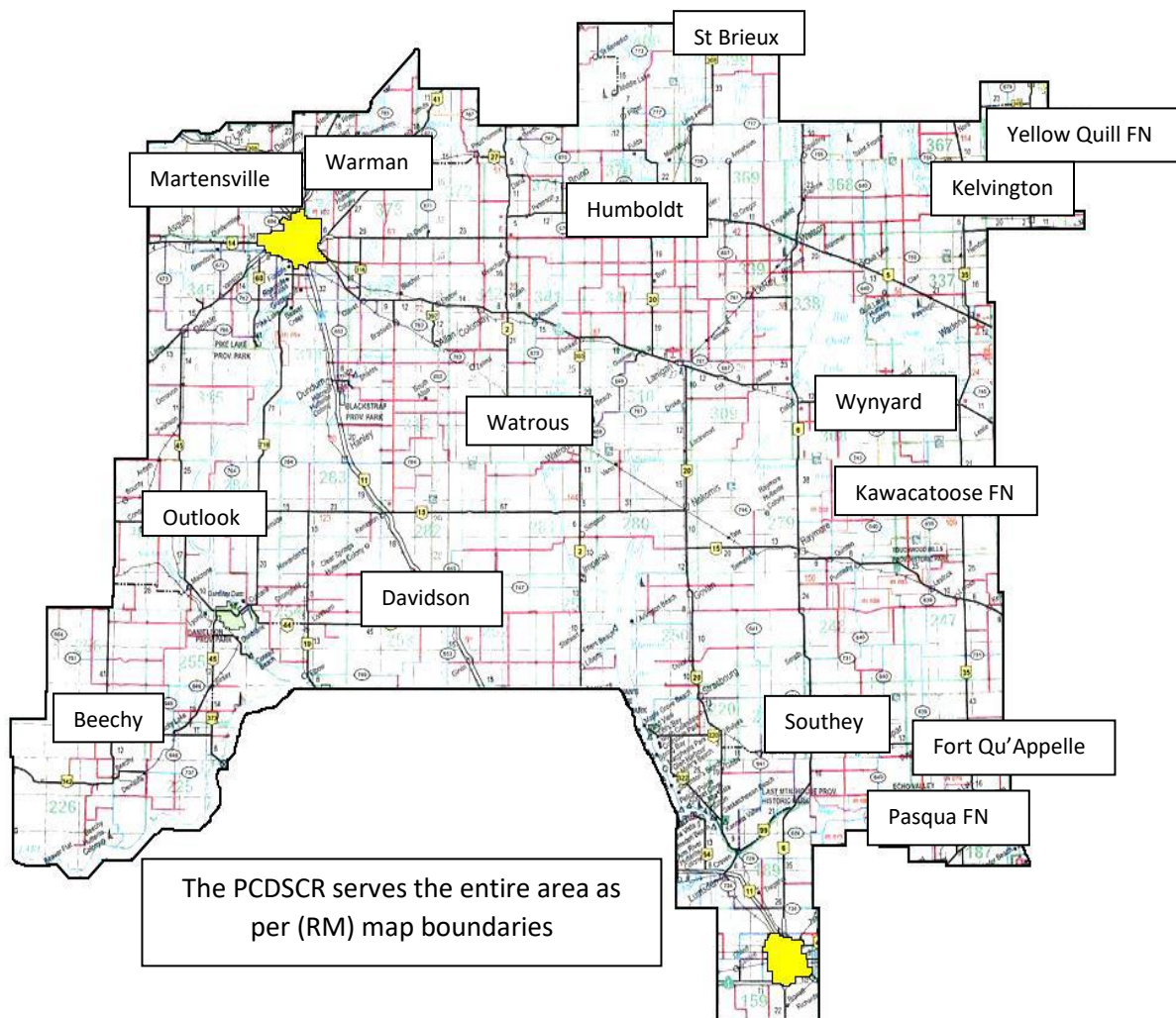

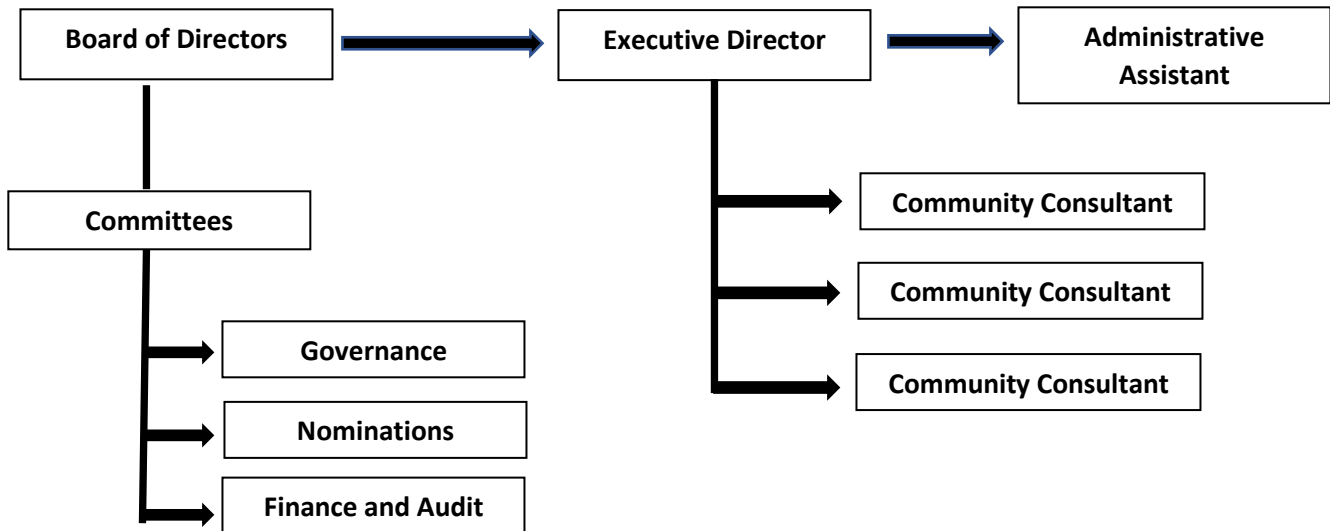
We provide leadership and support by building bridges and partnership through sport, culture and recreation for the benefit of the district

## The Board of Directors

- is a policy governance board who recognizes that the Board exists to govern on behalf of the membership
- determines who the membership is and how they can be heard
- develop the overall strategic direction of the organization with the power of the Board as a group not individuals
- represent diverse points of view that through discussion, resolve to present a common view
- consist of 6-10 individual representatives of sport, culture and recreation (8 directors at large + 2 Aboriginal directors)
- convene 5 meetings annually as follows:
  - ❖ June – AGM – centrally located (Watrous)
  - ❖ Sept – annual board planning and staff retreat
  - ❖ November
  - ❖ January – conference call
  - ❖ March
- at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting
  - ❖ set meeting details (date, time, location, etc) for the upcoming year
  - ❖ elect the Executive (Chairperson and Vice Chairperson) to a one year term
  - ❖ appoint committees (Chairperson and members) to a one year term
- may appoint a director for the unexpired term of the vacant position

## Directors

- elected to a two year term and shall not serve more than 3 continuous terms
- act honestly and in good faith with a view for the best interests of the District
- exercise care, diligence and skill that a reasonably prudent person would in comparable circumstances
- have no mandatory role in the area of programs and services of the organization
- ensure the financial health of the organization while providing direction to the Executive Director
