Vision


We support communities to promote quality of life through sport, culture and recreation

We provide leadership and support by building bridges and partnership through sport, culture and recreation for the benefit of the district



The Board of Directors

- is a policy governance board who recognizes that the Board exists to govern on behalf of the membership
- determines who the membership is and how they can be heard
- develop the overall strategic direction of the organization with the power of the Board as a group not individuals
- represent diverse points of view that through discussion, resolve to present a common view
- is comprised of up to 8 community minded individuals representing sport, culture and/or recreation
- convene 5 meetings annually as follows:
 - June AGM centrally located (Watrous)
 - Sept annual board planning and staff retreat
 - November
 - ❖ January conference call
 - March
- at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting
 - set meeting details (date, time, location, etc) for the upcoming year
 - elect the Executive (Chairperson and Vice Chairperson) to a one year term
 - appoint committees (Chairperson and members) to a one year term
- may appoint a director for the unexpired term of the vacant position

Directors

- elected to a two year term and shall not serve more than 3 continuous terms, except if there is a vacancy on the Board.
- act honestly and in good faith with a view for the best interests of the District
- exercise care, diligence and skill that a reasonably prudent person would in comparable circumstances
- have no mandatory role in the area of programs and services of the organization
- ensure the financial health of the organization while providing direction to the Executive Director
