

What to Do:

- 1. Prepare & Plan:** Pick a day with sticky snow and a quiet spot. Gather tools and sketch a design.
- 2. Build & Shape:** Pack snow into a stable base, shape it, and carve details like arms and facial features.
- 3. Finalize & Preserve:** Smooth surfaces, refine details, and add a water layer for an icy finish if desired.



What to Do:

- 1. Catch falling snowflakes on a dark container or cloth.**
- 2. Use magnifying glasses to observe the shapes and details of each snowflake.**
- 3. Compare different snowflakes—are they all the same?**
- 4. Lightly mist snowflakes with water and watch how they change or melt!**
- 5. Discuss how snowflakes form and why they have unique patterns.**
- 6. Fill your container with snow**



What to Do:

- 1. Go on a nature walk to gather small natural items. Avoid picking live plants or damaging trees.**
- 2. Use this as an opportunity to discuss what's safe and respectful to collect.**
- 3. Place the natural items into the containers, arranging them as desired.**
- 4. Lay a loop of string or twine into each container, ensuring part of the loop sticks out of the water when it freezes.**
- 5. Fill the containers with just enough water to cover the items.**
- 6. Ensure the string is submerged enough to freeze securely in place.**
- 7. Place the containers outside in freezing temperatures**
- 8. Carefully pop the frozen ornaments out of the containers.**
- 9. Hang them on tree branches outside, adding a sparkly, festive touch to nature.**



What to Do:

- 1.Fill silicone cupcake holders with water and place small natural items inside for decoration.**
- 2.Set them outside to freeze. If it's very cold, they may freeze within a few hours!**
- 3.Once frozen, pop them out and arrange them into an "ice cupcake display" or stack them into a mini ice tower.**
- 4.Experiment with adding layers of colored water for multi-layered ice cupcakes!**



What do you do?

Get Ready:

Grab a journal and basic art supplies like pencils, pens, and coloured pencils. Choose a spot in nature that inspires you.

Observe and Record:

Spend time in your chosen spot observing plants, animals, and the environment. Make simple sketches and jot down short descriptions. Date your entries. Make sure to record what you see, smell, feel and hear.

Reflect and Share:

Take a moment to reflect on your experiences. Add interesting facts, personal thoughts, and emotions. Make it a habit, share your progress with others and celebrate the beauty you capture.



What to Do:

- 1. Pack snow tightly into the molds and carefully remove them to create fun snow shapes.**
- 2. Use the spray bottles to add color to the snow molds, making vibrant snow sculptures.**
- 3. Create a winter village, a snow animal zoo, or a colorful path of snow shapes.**
- 4. Challenge kids to make patterns or mix colors to see what happens!**



What to Do:

1.Prepare and Mix:

2.Fill clean spray bottles with water, leaving space at the top. Add food coloring, then shake to mix.

3.Painting:

4.Spray colored water onto snow to create shapes and patterns.

5.Enjoy & Clean-Up:

6.Experiment with colors, then dispose of leftover water properly. Rinse bottles to prevent staining and store for reuse.
