

What to Do:

- 1. Create individual or group chalk artwork.**
- 2. Encourage nature-inspired drawings, patterns, or storytelling.**
- 3. Create a gallery walk where students view and discuss each other's art.**



What to Do:

- 1. Choose a paint chip card.**
- 2. Search outside for natural items that match each colour.**
- 3. Compare what everyone found and see which colours were easiest or hardest to match.**



What to Do:

- 1. Collect a few small natural items.**
- 2. Arrange them on your bookmark template to create a design.**
- 3. Use a hot glue gun to attach the items.**
- 4. Let the bookmark cool before using it.**



What to Do:

- 1. Collect a variety of natural loose parts.**
- 2. Arrange them on the ground to create a picture, pattern, or design.**
- 3. Try making a bug, flower, face, nature scene, or a 3D structure.**
- 4. Rearrange the pieces to create something completely different.**



What to Do:

- 1. Collect natural loose parts from the environment.**
- 2. Create circular artwork by starting in the middle and building outward.**
- 3. Add patterns, symmetry, and colour designs using natural materials.**



What to Do:

- 1. Collect a few natural treasures.**
- 2. Tie them to a stick with string.**
- 3. Hang your nature mobile from a tree branch and watch it move in the wind.**



What to Do:

- 1. Create a simple weaving frame using sticks.**
- 2. Weave natural materials through the frame.**
- 3. Change materials to explore different colours and textures.**



What to Do:

- 1. Collect natural materials and attach them to sticks using elastics or string.**
- 2. Experiment with different materials to see what textures and patterns they create.**
- 3. Use the homemade brushes with paint or water to create artwork.**



What to Do:

- 1. Collect smooth rocks**
- 2. Paint or colour the rocks. What creations can you come up with?**



What to Do:

- 1. Place objects or friends where their shadows are visible.**
- 2. Trace the outline of the shadows.**
- 3. Add details, patterns, or drawings to turn the shadows into artwork.**
- 4. Revisit later to observe how shadows have changed.**



What to Do:

- 1. Use snow or ice to build sculptures.**
- 2. Decorate sculptures with natural materials.**



What to Do:

- 1. Collect sticks and natural materials.**
- 2. Build three-dimensional sculptures by connecting pieces together.**
- 3. Try to create animals, shelters, structures, or imaginary creations.**



What to Do:

- 1. Place paper over textured natural objects such as bark or leaves.**
- 2. Rub crayons across the paper to reveal patterns and details.**
- 3. Compare textures from different objects and discuss similarities and differences.**
